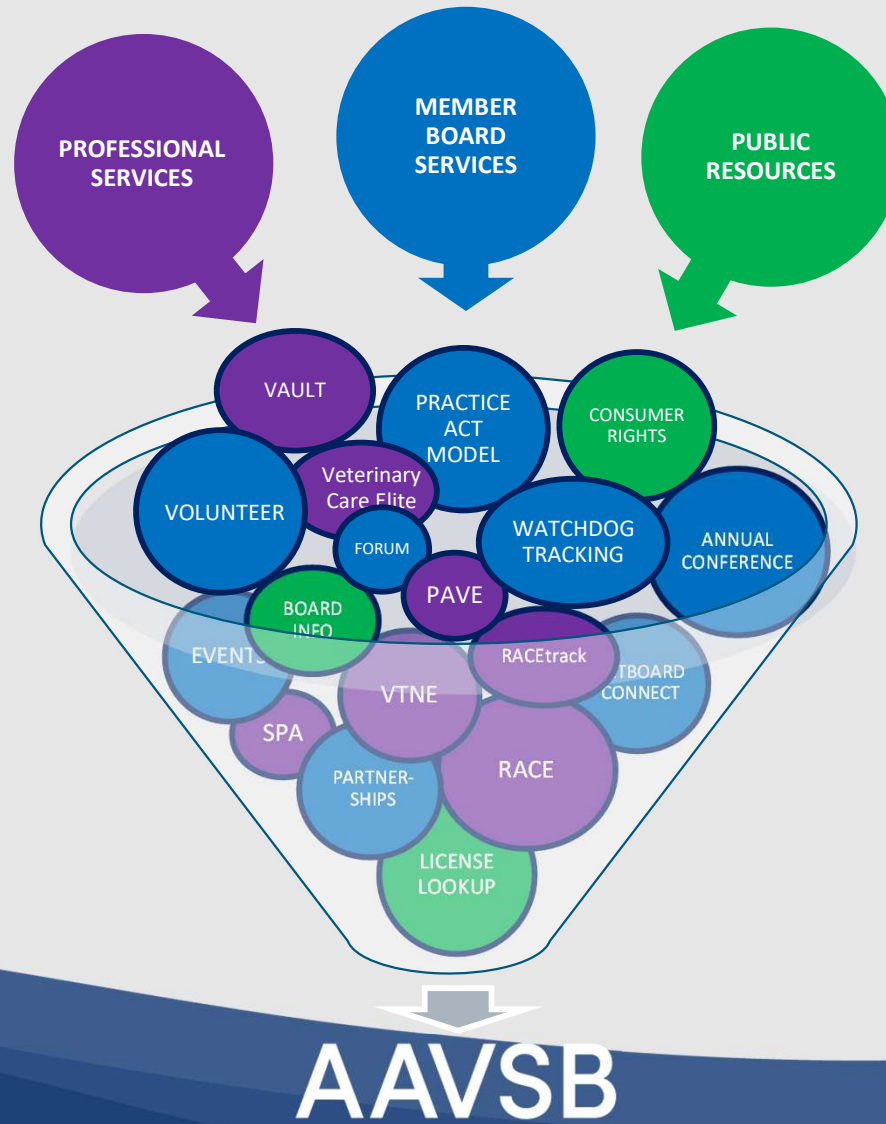

Licensure Assistance



- Launched in 2022
- Eight (8) boards are accepting PAVE; Several expect to statute and rule changes in 2023/2023
- Thirty-two (32) AVMA-CVTEA and CVMA accredited veterinary technology/nursing programs are participating in accepting candidates for the gap course(s) requirement.



- Administration of jurisprudence examinations
- Fees paid by candidate based on how exam is administered
- AAVSB administers the state exam for Iowa, North Carolina, and Wisconsin veterinary technicians. Louisiana will be utilizing SPA for veterinary technicians very soon.



- For international graduates of non-AVMA and CVMA-accredited programs
- 54 Member Boards recognize PAVE for Veterinarians as well as Australia, New Zealand, Quebec, and several Canadian territories

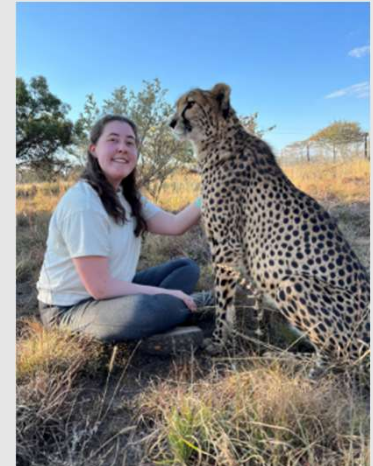

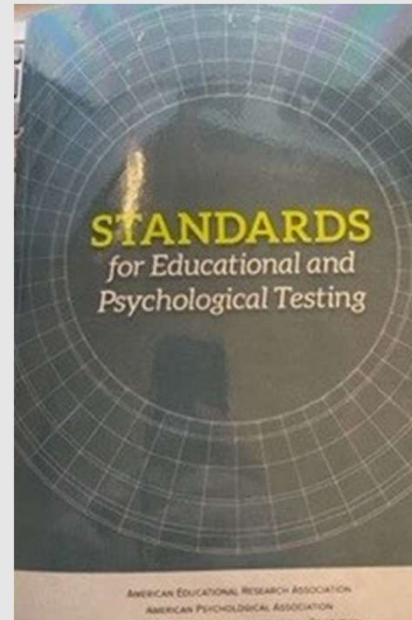

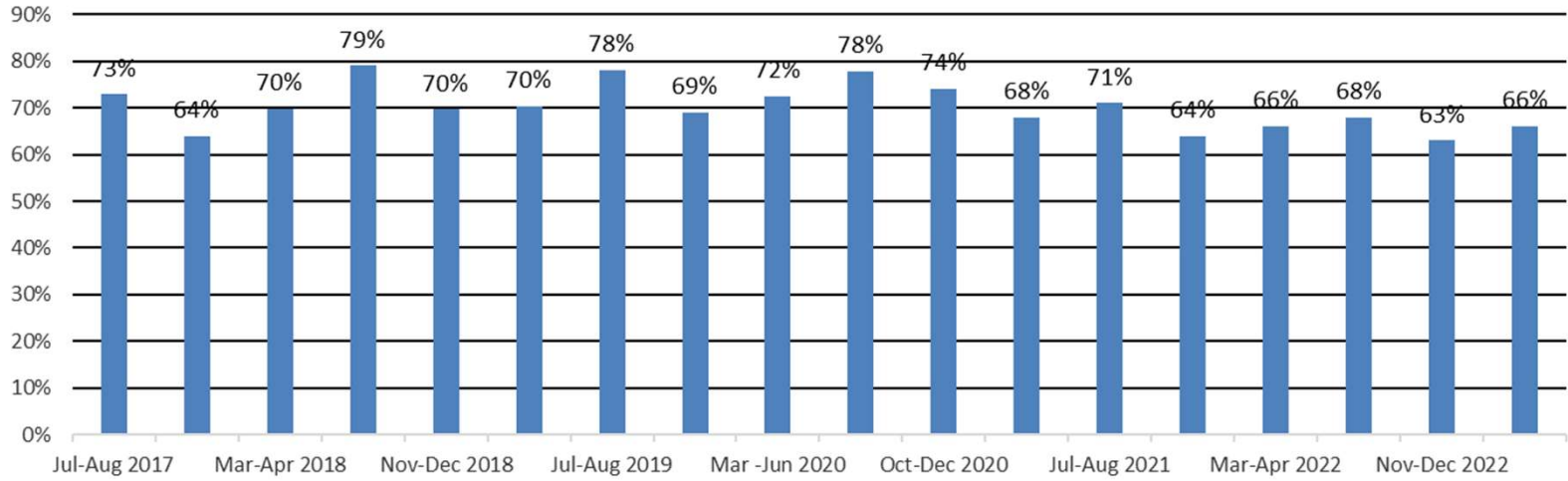


The Veterinary Technician National Examination

Job Analysis

- Define the job's knowledge and skills (KSA) specific to a new veterinary technology graduate
- Survey large group of veterinary technicians to determine which KSA's are performed and how critical they are
- Used to develop the Content Outline for the VTNE

A	Utilize knowledge of anatomy, physiology, and pathophysiology as it applies to the use of pharmacological, chemical, and biological agents.	
B	Prepare medications in compliance with veterinarian's orders.	
C	Calculate medications, fluid therapy rate, and continuous rate infusions based on the appropriate dosage in compliance with veterinarian's orders.	
D	Dispense medications in compliance with veterinary orders.	
E	Maintain controlled drug inventory, related logbooks, and medical records.	
F	Recognize classifications of drugs, their mechanisms, and clinically relevant side effects.	
G	Store, handle, and safely dispose of pharmacological, chemical, and biological agents.

Exam Development Steps Aligning to New Content Outline

April & June 2023

In-person workshop with VTNE Committee and additional SME's to develop two new practice tests, item writing, and new exam forms

August 2023

Standard Setting workshop to set the passing point to be recommended to the AAVSB Board of Directors for final approval

September 2023

In-person workshop to continue development of new forms



Standard Setting

- Not a simple percentage
- To determine passing score of the "minimally competent candidate"
- To protect the public from harm caused by incompetent professional practice
- To provide a valid and consistent way of identifying those who are competent to practice in the profession



New VTNE Content Outline and Practice Tests on AAVSB website

New Content Outline will be available on the AAVSB website on August 15 and Practice Tests will be available in September to align with the VTNE administration November 15 - December 15, 2023

November/December 2023 VTNE application window opens November 15 – October 15
