

Your vet sci program is already great and you are here at this conference to learn how to make it even better. Why add a travel abroad experience to the already busy curriculum?






WHY

take students on a study trip abroad?

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I see students return from this trip with a sense of confidence that goes beyond preceptorships/internships skills.

Braving air travel, immediately seeing and working with wild animals, meeting new professionals, living in different situations, trying new foods, and working with familiar species in vastly different settings, are all part of why student return from a vet sci educational trip changed, more confident and more focused on their career path(s).





Soon to be graduates are so focused on classes that learning about all this profession has to offer them can get lost with the academia, funneling them into a path that may not be a great fit for all that they have learned.




What is EcoLife?
