



Percent of Balance 90+ Days Delinquent





U.S. consumers bounce-back








Nonfarm Employment Payroll Additions


U.S. unemployment

Average home sales price





Pets, Pet Products, Veterinarian Services




Real GDP





Percentage of U.S. households that own dogs and cats



Dog and cat owners



Percentage of pet owners who visited the veterinarian in the previous calendar year, as reported in 2023 and 2024





- Pet Owners that took their pet to the veterinarian at least once in the previous calendar year






Majority of graduates entering full-time employment


Species focus of new graduate veterinarians


DVM debt upon graduation

Position of employment for Census respondents










Respondent annual gross income


22% of respondents reported working more than 1 job




Average size of veterinary practice workforce

Gross revenue per FTE veterinarian and veterinarian to staff ratio




Gross revenue per FTE veterinarian increases with an increase in veterinarian to staff ratio up to about 5 FTE non-veterinarian staff per FTE veterinarian. **Optimum ratio = 5:1**

Research Findings Framework

Profile Utilization: skill level, confidence, opportunity



"I fully use my skills at work."

Veterinary technician perspective: Agreement heavily relied on opportunity to apply the skills rather than skill level.

 Leaders play a critical role in matching team members' skills and qualifications to the appropriate tasks, which boosts confidence, job satisfaction, and retention.



Research Insights

Questions to Ask

Veterinary Teams:

 How well do we collaborate as a team, and are we building the relationships necessary to ensure trust and effective communication in our daily work?

Veterinary Leaders and Educators:

 Are my team members both qualified and confident in their skills, and do I consistently provide them with opportunities to practice those skills?





Key takeaways

- □ Veterinary trends show slowing visits and is aligned with U.S. macroeconomic trends. It is unlikely veterinary visits will increase without more optimism in the broader U.S. economy.
- □ Veterinarians and Veterinary Technicians face different challenges when considering the future of their respective professions.
- Optimizing team performance requires a multifaceted approach that involves managers and employees. Preliminary research suggests the opportunity to use a Veterinary Technician's full skill set is a large part of job satisfaction.
