






MILESTONES IN VET. MED.

- 1800 BC to 1500 AD: Egyptians, Greeks and Romans record treating animal Dxs. Acupuncture used in animal patients in China > 3,000 Yrs.
- 1600 "Livestock Doctors" emerge in U.S.
 Colonies (M.D.'s)
- 1700 European Veterinary Schools established (Lyon, France 1761 = 259 yrs.)





VETERINARY POPULATION, 2016




Estimated number of veterinarians as of December 31, 2016: 107,995





FUTURE for VETERINARY MEDICINE

The Bureau of Labor Statistics expects opportunities for veterinarians to rise 18% and opportunities for veterinary technicians to increase 20% through 2026*

*AVMA Smart Brief Nov. 2017

Veterinarians ranked No. 8 on the list of the 25 best health care jobs of 2020, beating out RNs, Physical therapists, speechlanguage pathologists, pharmacists and chiropractors.

Every year, US News & World Report analyzes the job market and future job market outlook to rank the 100 best jobs. In 2020, veterinarians made the list at No. 10.

Suicide risk for veterinarians twice that of general population

- According to a new study*, female **veterinarians** are 2.4 times more likely and male veterinarians are 1.6 more likely to die by suicide (**Pentobarbital**)
- The suicide rate for male **veterinary technicians** and technologists was five times higher for men and 2.3 times higher for women than the average U.S. citizen. Many of those deaths were due to **opioid** suicide overdoses.
- "Based on the research findings, prevention activities should be aimed at veterinary technicians as well as veterinarians," researchers wrote in the study. "In addition, the results indicate the higher likelihood for suicide among veterinarians compared with the general population might be attributable to pentobarbital access."
- Reasons for increased rates: Educational debt, euthanasia of pets, owners who opt out of recommended treatment, access to pentobarbital.


