 - a. Verifying student arrival and departure at third party sites
 - b. File cabinets and storage rooms full of ripped/torn/stained pieces of paper

- c. Manual "counting" and "calculating" of student competencies and skills to ensure each student has met their graduation requirements
- d. Manual reporting and excel spreadsheets
- e. Students aren't as engage with paper documentation versus using technology
- 3. Main Point: Benefits of Electronic Recordkeeping
 - a. Accurate, up-to-date, and complete information without having to decipher students and preceptor handwriting
 - b. No Manual Calculations of Case Counts and Lab Competencies
 - i. Third party systems automatically track and calculate
 - c. Accurately track students' arrival and departure
 - i. Have you ever had an issue with academic dishonestly?
 - ii. Paper documentation does not have GPS to verify students arrived at their shifts
 - d. No more file cabinets and storage rooms full of papers or lost documentation
 - i. Concerns of loss of paperwork
 - ii. Fires
 - iii. Torn, ripped documentation
 - e. Confidential Preceptor Evaluations
 - i. Sealing evaluations in envelopes does not prevent students from viewing
 - f. Easy retrieval of documentation, signatures, and reporting
 - i. Combing through file cabinets and student files could take hours
 - g. Students are training for real careers
 - i. Paper charting no longer exists, yet we expect students to document on paper
